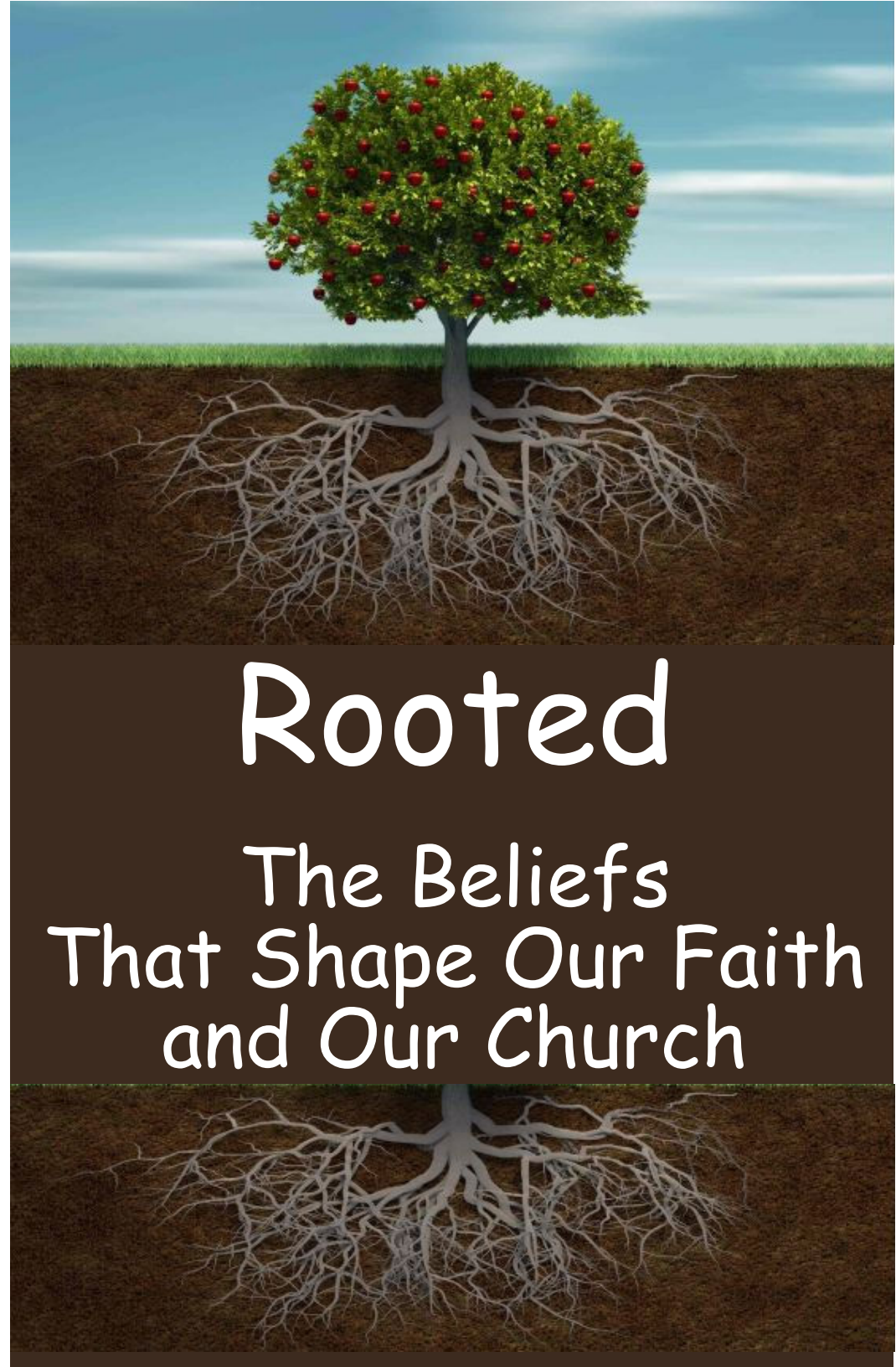

Let's look at five principles about baptism before we close.

First: the act of baptism does not save us – Jesus Christ saves us.

Second: baptism is a demonstration of our acceptance of Christ as savior and Lord

Third: baptism is the point in time when we have the assurance of God's forgiveness.

Fourth: baptism should usually be performed as soon as possible after one surrenders to Jesus Christ.

Fifth: baptism should be a source of unity – not division – among Christians.

VIII. The Literal Return of Jesus to Earth as He Promised

A. Jesus said in John 14:3, “I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am.”

B. Jesus Christ is going to come back to earth some day.

IX. The Resurrection and Assignment of All People to Heaven or to Hell

A. We are sometimes criticized for too rigid a stand.

People often wish that the Bible did not say anything about Hell.

B. The Bible says that there will be a place of punishment for those who disobey God.

The Bible uses three (3) words to describe hell:

 _____ signifying *pain*
 _____ implying *loneliness* or *alienation*

Jesus believed in hell. He taught it as a reality. He used the most descriptive language to try to persuade people to avoid it.

C. The question is often asked: “How could a loving God send anyone to hell?”

Hell was not created for people. It was created as a place of punishment for Satan and his angels.

People need to know that if they choose to reject God, God respects their freedom of choice so much that He lets them go.

2. Now let's look at some distinctives we hold in reference to baptism.

a. First, baptism is only for those who are old enough to believe.

1. There is no example in the Bible of an infant or somebody being baptized against their will.

2. Baptism in the Bible was for those who were capable of being taught and for those who were capable of repenting of their sin. Doing it of their own free will:

b. The second distinctive is that baptism should be by immersion.

c. Baptism is for the remission of sins and the receiving of the Holy Spirit.

What the Bible Teaches about Ordinances

1. There are three distinctives that we hold in reference to communion.

Third: we believe that the Lord's Supper is a participation in his body.

We can each say, "I'm better than Adolph Hitler and Charles Manson and Joseph Stalin," but, when we look at God's law, the "**straight _____ of the law**", we see how crooked we really are.

Some people say, "I don't think God would ever condemn anyone to hell. We are condemned already. God, in a rescue effort, is offering salvation. If we don't accept that, we have condemned ourselves.

Consider God's dilemma. Man was alienated and God wanted to reach out to him, but the law said if you sin, you'll die. So God _____ the gap in Jesus Christ.

Notice that Jesus was the only one who could bridge the gap because He was both spirit and flesh. He was holy, but He was also a man. That's the _____ of the incarnation.

But Jesus was _____ than a man. He was God in the flesh.

But Jesus did more than just come down and _____ God. Jesus came to the world not to be just a good teacher, not just to represent God, but He came to the world to die. He was _____ to die. He became an atonement for our sins.

Sin means _____ !

Jesus was perfect – sinless, but His blood was shed. The Bible tells us that He was led like a sheep to the slaughter. A crown of thorns pierced His brow and the blood flowed. They viciously whipped His back and the blood flowed. They pounded nails in His hands and feet. When He died, they thrust a spear into His side and the blood flowed mingled with water.

On the cross, Jesus' blood was shed as He paid the ultimate price to **forgive** your sins and my sins. God's love was revealed. God's justice was satisfied.

How Reliable is the Bible?

How do we know that the Bible is true? What if the Bible is just a compilation of legends? What if it is full of misinformation? Are we to accept it by blind faith?

In this lesson, we want to look at some reasons why we, as Christians, can have confidence in the Word of God.

A. Facts about the Scripture

The Bible is a library of 66 books written by approximately 40 different authors over a period of 1,500 years.

1. Its prophecies are fulfilled
